

The following dress code will be in effect for ALL school functions, field trips, sports and other school events.

Spirit of the Dress Code:

The spirit of the dress code is to: 1) present ourselves as Christian witnesses through modesty 2) promote safety in the school and 3) prepare students for responsibilities and requirements of future professions and pursuits. The intention is not to provide a list of rules, but to promote student responsibility by following the spirit of the policy.

Dress Code:

Clothing should be free from violent, obscene, or distracting language or images as well as bands. Clothing should be safe, non-disruptive, fit comfortably (not overly tight or excessively baggy), cover any undergarments, and free from rips, tears, and holes.

Hooded sweatshirts and jackets are permitted, however hoods must not be up while in the school building. Hats, head scarves, and head coverings are not permitted.

Hairstyles should be of a natural hue without stripes or extreme hairstyles.

Any shoes, boots, sandals (including slides) may be worn except flip flops and slippers.

Girls may wear earrings.

No visible tattoos are permitted.

QCCS has ultimate authority to evaluate compliance with the dress code policy and the spirit of the policy.

Examples for Boys:

Pants may include dress pants, khakis, jeans, or athletic materials other than yoga pants, sweat pants, and pajama pants.

Shorts, may be worn if they are 3 inches above the knee or longer when standing.

Shirts may include any collared shirts, t-shirts, sweaters, crew necks, and polo shirts that are not transparent and include sleeves.

Boys should be clean shaven.

Examples for Girls:

Pants may include dress pants, khakis, jeans, capri pants or athletic materials other than yoga pants, sweat pants, and pajama pants. Leggings are permitted under dresses or skirts that follow the requirements below.

Dresses, shorts, and skirts may be worn if they are 3 inches above the knee or longer when standing.

Shirts may include any collared shirts, blouses, t-shirts, sweaters, crew necks, and polo shirts that are not transparent, and cover the midriff and cleavage.

Tank tops may be worn if straps are at least the width of four fingers..

Dress Code Enforcement:

When an item is inappropriate as determined by the spirit of the policy, students are expected to change clothes. A reminder warning with a note will be sent home to parents to be signed and returned the next day. Any future violation will result in a detention.

Repeated violations (3 or more in one month or intentional repeated violations) indicate the student is not exhibiting the responsibility needed to follow the spirit of the dress code guidelines. Therefore, that student will no longer have the opportunity to participate in the above dress code. Upon violating the dress code as defined above (as determined by QCCS administration), the student's required dress code for the remainder of the year will be: khaki pants and polo or collared shirts.

We encourage students to be proactive in asking QCCS if "borderline" articles of clothing follow with the spirit of the dress code.
